PhD in Data Science Approved!

It has been a long journey, but the School of Data Science has big news! The Ph.D. program in Data Science will launch in the Fall of 2025, catering to both aspiring industry professionals and university educators. This interdisciplinary program will emphasize core technical skills like machine learning and statistics, while also exploring the social and ethical implications of data use. This exciting addition builds on the existing Master's and Bachelor's programs offered by the School of Data Science. The program also marks a new chapter for the School itself. It will formally join the College of Computing and Informatics, fostering collaboration across the university. Dongsong Zhang has been named interim director, while Doug Hague transitions to a new role focused on corporate engagement. This is just the beginning! Stay tuned for more information about the Ph.D. program and the School of Data Science's future endeavors.

The Student Government Association (SGA) acts as the voice of undergraduate students at UNC Charlotte. They address student concerns and advocate for positive changes on campus, like better facilities or policy adjustments. They also provide financial support through various funding options. Undergraduate student organizations can get operational funding, travel grants, and event

funding for both on-campus and off-campus activities. There's a separate process for graduate students and sports clubs.
